The Bulls Flying Doctor Service opened its new hangar and avmed complex at Palmerston North in December, marking the extension of a unique service to New Zealand pilots developed by Dr Dave Baldwin. Over 250 invited guests attended the event, which saw the facility officially opened by Director of Civil Aviation, John Jones.

With 1,300 pilots on the books, Dr Dave regularly flies to remote airstrips in the East Coast of the North Island, Blenheim and Motueka, and the West Coast, Mt Cook, and Te Anau. Now the aviation medical centre and hangar provides an HQ for the service.
